Stop 1 Mkuru Maasai Village

4 immersive days of spirituality, culture, and nature
Welcome to Mkuru, a small Maasai village nestled in the savannah, where the sacred mountain Mukuru rises majestically on the horizon, and Mount Kilimanjaro watches over us with its imposing grace..



Mkuru is not just a stop.
It is a sacred place,
a bridge between past and future.

Unique Experiences

- Sacred ceremonies and traditional rituals with our Maasai friends
- Visits to community projects: primary school, water supply network, agroforestry initiatives
- Trekking up Mount Mukuru (2,100 m), the "Mountain of God"
- Visits to Maasai families in their bomas: conversations, games with children, and everyday life
- Evenings by the fire: ancestral stories passed down through generations

Day 1: You will be welcomed by the Maasai wisdom keepers. Lunch (depending on arrival time) and time to relax by the lodge's pool. In the afternoon, explore the nearby villages and bomas. In the evening, storytelling around the fire.

Day 2: Early morning walk (5:00 AM) to the Mukuru hilltop for sunrise and breakfast in the savannah. Return for lunch. Afternoon Maasai dance rituals and rungu competition – a traditional throwing stick and cultural symbol of the warriors.

Day 3: Excursion to the Whispering Cave, with blessings from the Maasai elders. After lunch, visit the community bomas.

Day 4: Visit local schools and water projects in Mkuru and Madepe villages. Discover the community's first syntropic garden, a milestone in sustainable agriculture.

A significant part of your experience directly supports children's education and the development of the local community. You'll have the opportunity to see it with your own eyes — and feel it with your heart.



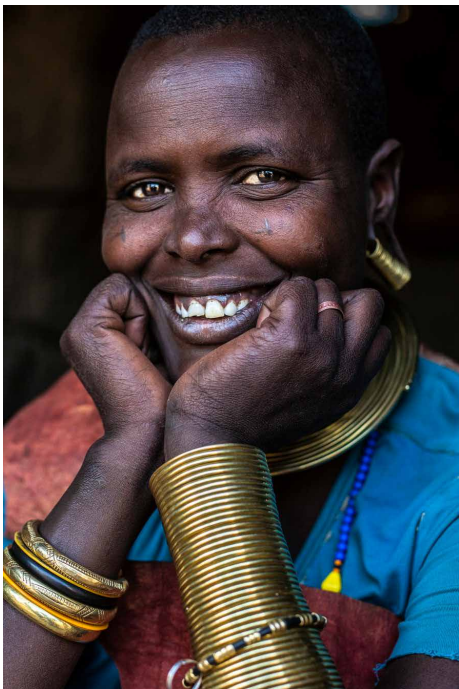
Stop 2 Lake Eyasi — The Hadzabe and Datoga Tribes

The Hadzabe

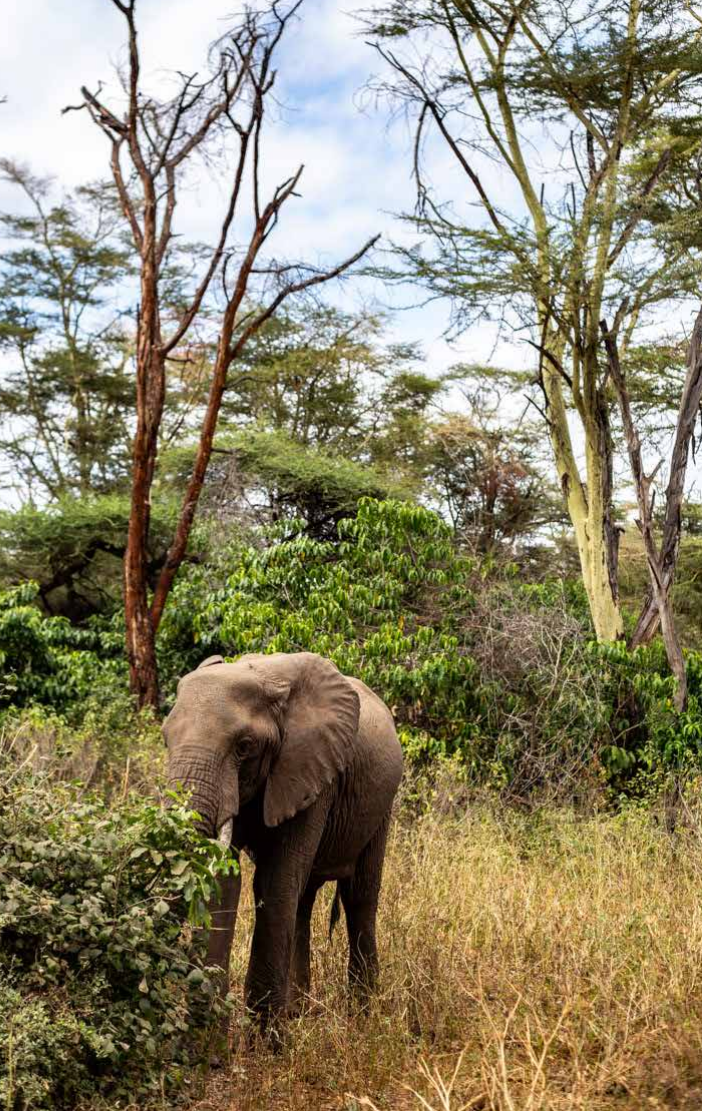
Nomadic hunter-gatherers, the Hadzabe people still live as they did in prehistoric times. They will guide us on a traditional hunt, demonstrating their ancestral techniques with bow and arrow, as well as their knowledge of wild plants and honey gathering.

The Datoga

Renowned pastoralists and skilled blacksmiths, the Datoga will welcome us into their forges, where — using ancestral methods — they craft arrowheads, spears, and metal ornaments. Datoga women are known for their distinctive facial and shoulder tattoos, rich in symbolic meaning.

Stop 3 Tarangire National Park

Departure at 6:00 AM for a full-day safari in one of Tanzania's most spectacular national parks, known for its monumental baobab trees, large elephant herds, and exceptional wildlife density.

Elephants, lions, leopards, zebras, wildebeest, buffaloes, antelopes, giraffes

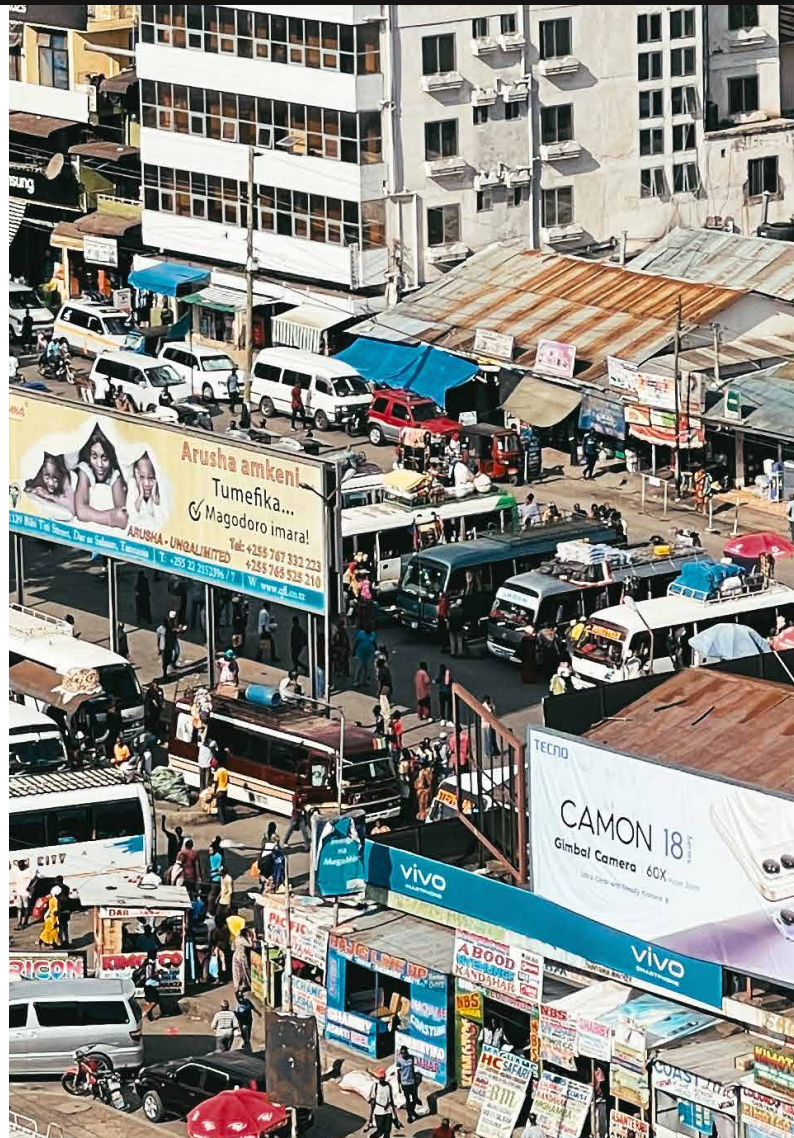
- **Birdlife**
